

CGC, CGCA & CGCU PREPERATION COURSE & TEST ONLY UNIVERSAL REGISTRATION

CANINE GOOD CITIZEN (CGC): This is a 3- week prep course followed by the test on the 4th week. The purpose of the Canine Good Citizen program is to ensure that our favorite companion, the dog, can be a respected member of the community because it is trained to act mannerly in the home, in public places and in the presence of other dogs. This preparation course welcomes both pure-bred and mix breed dogs. The test is non-competitive and all dogs who pass all 10 items will receive a certificate (that you must submit) from the American Kennel Club. Test only is also available.

Requirements: Completion of CSC's Basic Beginner Obedience 101 (or equivalent). *Completion of CSC's Advance Beginner Obedience 201 (or equivalent) is highly recommended. This is not a basic obedience skills course, and this should be taken into consideration when enrolling.* On the day of the test, you must show a valid rabies certificate. You must also bring a brush to the class sessions and test.

AKC COMMUNITY CANINE (CGCA): This is a 3- week prep course followed by test on the 4th week. CGCA is the advanced level of the CGC program. As with CGC, CGCA has a 10-step test of skills that dogs must pass to earn the official CGCA title. This is a title that appears on the dog's title record at AKC. This is available to both purebred and mixed breeds. All skills on the test are tested on leash. The CGCA test may be done in a class, at shows, in a pet store or in community. Test only is also available.

AKC URBAN CGC (CGCU): This is 3- week prep followed by test on the 4th week. Requires dogs that demonstrate CGC skills and beyond in a setting that includes traffic, crowds, noises, smells, and other distractions that are present in a city or town. As the CGC, CGCU is a 10-step test of skills that dogs must pass to earn the official CGCU title. This is a title that appears on the dog's title record at AKC. CGCU is a public access test that demonstrates dogs are well behaved and well-trained when in public settings The CGCA test can be used by dog-friendly business (e.g., lodging, retail, transportation, public facilities) to recognize and accept dogs with good manners. This is available for both purebreds and mix breeds. Test only is also available.

The class has a limited enrollment of 6-10 students, so it is essential that you **return the form below with your payment** (make checks payable to Canine Sports Center) for \$100.00 (tax included) as soon as possible. VISA, Discover & MC accepted. Payment must accompany registration in order for the registration to be considered valid. Faxed registrations are NOT considered valid without noted payment. If the requested course is full, you will be notified immediately. Otherwise, a confirmation will be e-mailed, or you will receive a phone call no later than 3-5 days prior to the start of the course, or you may call to confirm your enrollment.

NOTE: Fees are non-refundable after the first meeting of the course.
****Bitches that go into season are not allowed to attend class. We do not offer refunds or transfers should this occur, please plan accordingly.****

VACCINATIONS: All new students or students who have not had vaccination history verified by CSC in the last 6 months, please bring your dog's vaccination history to the first night of class, including proof of rabies (please provide a copy of the rabies certificate), DHPP (lepto optional), and canine cough (Bordatella). Passing titers are acceptable for the DHPP requirement. Nosodes are allowed for dogs over 1 year of age when accompanied by a health certificate from a licensed veterinarian dated no longer than 15-days prior course start date.

- **Please bring your dog to the first session of class.**
- For further preparation for the prep course, all dogs are required to have a buckle or quick snap collar (we do not use chain chokes or prong collars in this prep course) as well as a 6-foot lead. Any further questions please call.

Important Note: During testing, no training aids such as Gentle Leaders or EasyWalk Harnesses can be used. The dog must be able to perform test on a flat buckle or quick snap collar without the aid of treats. Treats and training aids may be used during the training portion of the course only.

Directions:

- From the North: Rte. 8 South to Exit 44 to Torrington. Take Rte. 4 West to the Rotary in Goshen. Go left at the rotary, onto Rte. 63 South. Continue 2.0 miles and the Center is on the right.
- From the South: Rte. 8 North to Exit 42 to Rte. 118 West to Litchfield. Turn right in the center of Litchfield onto Rte. 63 North. Continue North 4.3 miles and the Center is on the left.
